



Community Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program (CPBSP)

UC Berkeley Safe Transportation Research and Education Center (SafeTREC) in collaboration with California Walks (Cal Walks) launched the CPBSP to reduce pedestrian and bicyclist fatalities and serious injuries in communities across California.

We prioritize working with communities at a disproportionate risk for road traffic injuries and addressing the safety needs of communities underserved by traditional transportation resources and planning, e.g., older adults, people with lower incomes, people with disabilities, immigrant or refugee populations, and more.

Our team works alongside a local Planning Committee (PC) to customize the workshop to fit the unique needs of each community. Please review the <u>Planning Committee Responsibilities</u> document for an outline of the responsibilities of the PC and those of <u>Cal Walks</u> and <u>SafeTREC</u>.



Who is eligible

The CPBSP is free and open to resident groups and coalitions, schools, community-based organizations, nonprofits, and local agencies. How to apply

Applications are now open and available in both English and Spanish.

Programs

Community Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Training (CPBST):

The CPBST is our original pedestrian and bicycle safety training. This program includes a Safe System overview, walk/bike assessment, crash data review, and action planning activity. This training curriculum has been presented in English, Spanish, Chinese, and Korean. Interpretation and translation is available as requested in these languages and more.

Comunidades Activas y Seguras (CAyS):

The CAyS program is our Spanish-language pedestrian and bicycle training. The program provides a culturally and linguistically competent curriculum to support the active transportation advocacy work of the communities we work with.

Program timeline:

The CPBST and CAyS programs consist of three initial planning meetings (two virtual, one in-person site visit), an in-person workshop, and an optional virtual debrief meeting after the workshop.

Follow-up support

Technical Assistance Program:

Follow-up support is available to former CPBST and CAyS sites to support their community's implementation of programs, projects, and recommendations outlined in their community action plan. This year, we will partner with five communities in two overarching areas: strengthening datadriven narratives and community leadership and capacity strengthening.
