Project Background

The Tribal Crash Data Online Tool is the product of a collaboration between the University of California, Berkeley's Safe Transportation Research and Education Center (SafeTREC) and the National Indian Justice Center.



The project is designed to prevent traffic collisions and injuries by gathering accurate traffic and crash data on and near tribal

lands. This project provides a starting point for California tribes to access and analyze tribal crash data from existing sources. In the long term, as tribes collect their own crash data, this online tool may be modified to incorporate tribal data.

Goals of the Training

The goals of the Training Session are to provide hands on access to the online crash data tool and to provide training on how to use the online data tool reports to support your transportation safety planning.

This training will also provide information about the next steps in the project which are to train tribes on crash data collection strategies. As tribes collect more local crash data, SafeTREC and NIJC would like to collaborate on how to include that data in the online data tool or SWITRS.

SafeTREC and NIJC are seeking participation from tribes to document crash fatalities and serious injuries on tribal land. They will work intensively with five (5) tribes willing to collect collision data that complies with the CHP Form 555 reporting criteria, with the goal of three (3) tribes committing to submit crash data to SWITRS.
